## Dorsey School of Beauty- Graduation, Licensure, and Placement

**Dorsey School of Beauty, Taylor**, main campus, is accredited by NACCAS (National Accrediting Commission for Career Arts & Sciences). The information provided below for Dorsey School of Beauty-Taylor was submitted to NACCAS in November 2023 as part of its annual report and is the most recent graduation, placement, and licensure data available. All information provided is for students with a contracted graduation date between the period of January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022.

The institution's accrediting agency has allowed flexibilities to the institution in the publication of its student outcome rates if the COVID-19 Pandemic has significantly impacted the ability of students to successfully graduate, sit for licensure and/or obtain employment.
